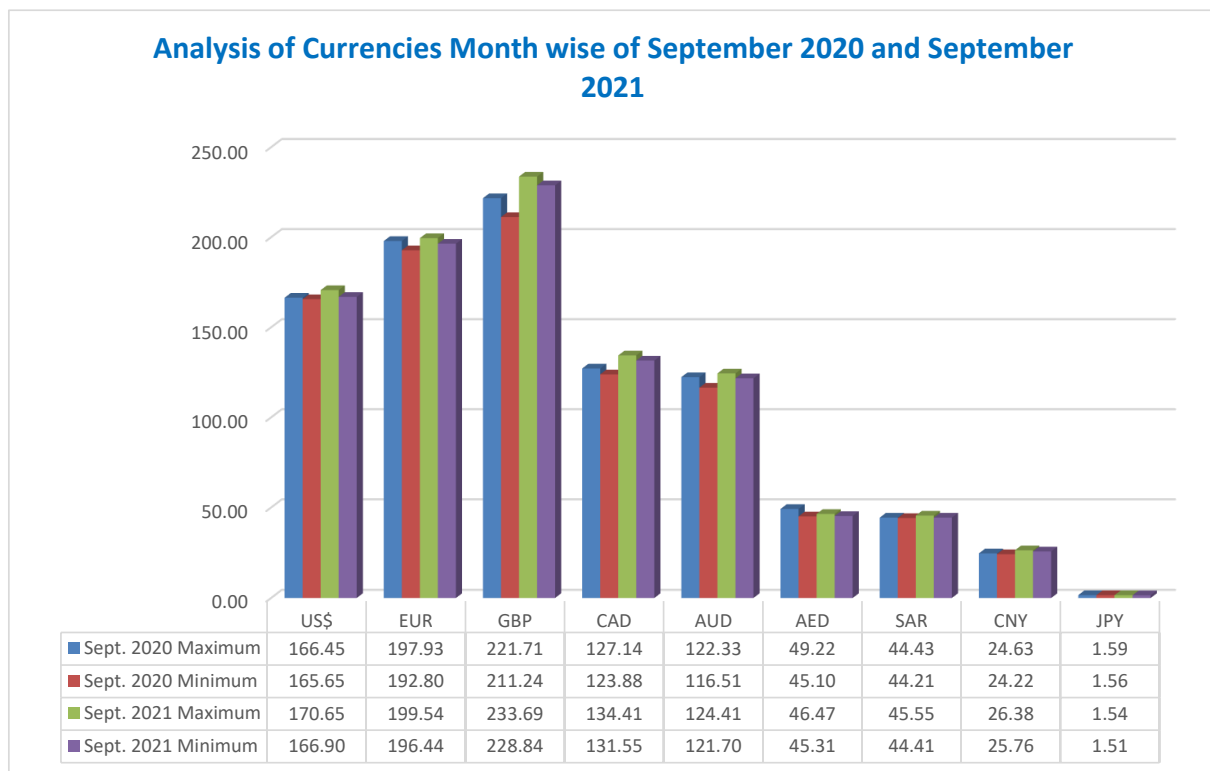

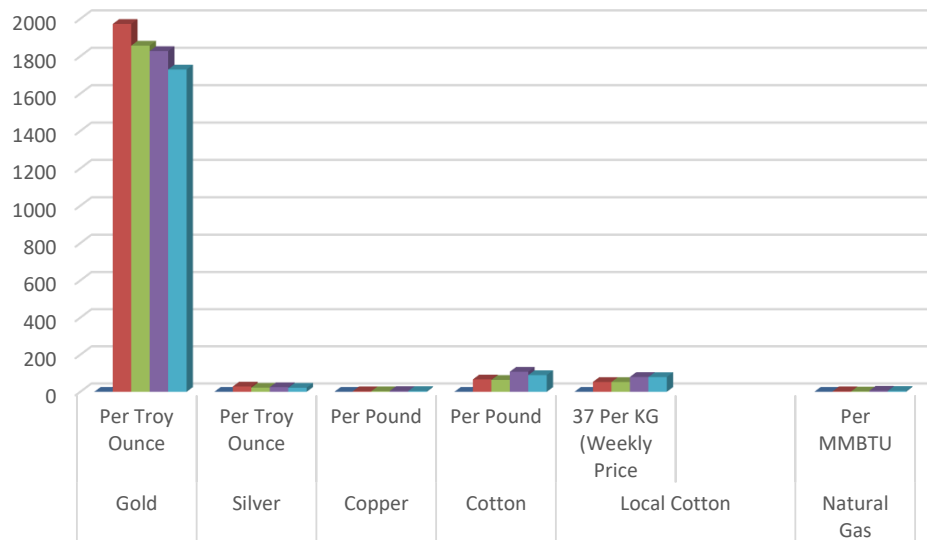

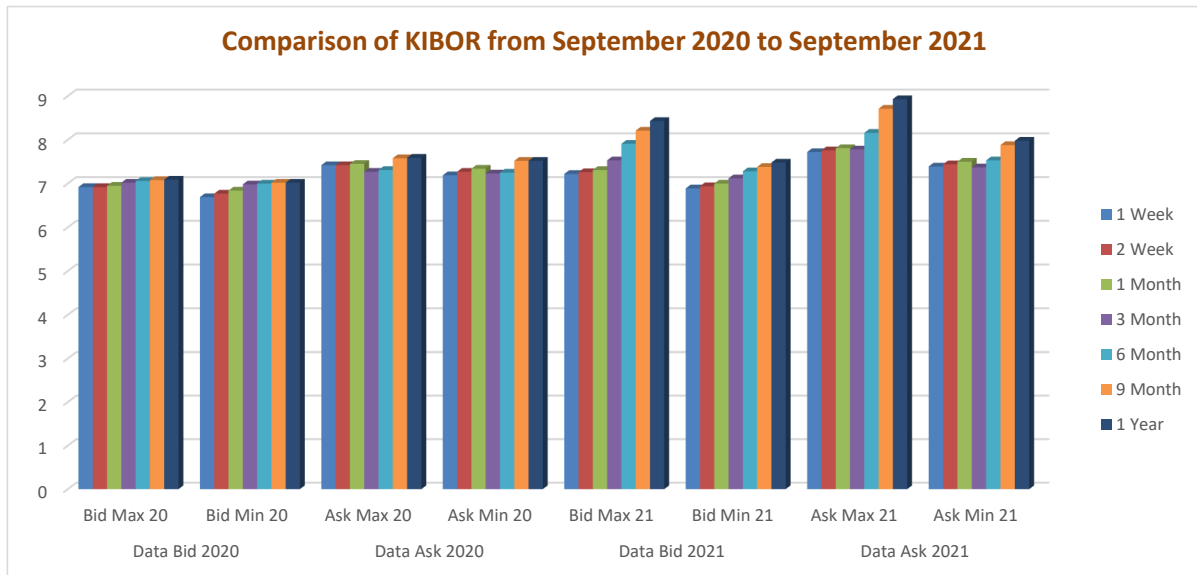

TMA delegation apprises minister of problems faced by exporters

KARACHI: A TMA delegation on Monday met with the Minister Port & Shipping, Syed Ali Haider Zaidi under the chairmanship of Kashif Mehtab Chawla along with senior members Syed Usman Ali, Aamir Hassan Lari and Muzzammil Husain, Secretary General of the Association. Kashif Mehtab Chawla thanked the Minister Port & Shipping, Syed Ali Haider Zaidi for having spared his valuable time for the TMA members to listen their problems. The chairman of the Towel Manufacturers Association of Pakistan highlighted that:



The Export sector is facing severe scarcity of containers as well as non-availability of ships for the export of our goods. Due to which we are in deep trouble and we request you to please sort out the problem on top priority as goods are ready to export on the occasion of Christmas. If we do not deliver our consignment in time, it will become a liability for us.



The second issue is that KPT allowed five days goods storage for export goods while Port Qasim allowed seven days for the same without any cost. After these specific periods of free of cost they charge \$15 per day from the exporters. Due to non-availability of ships and containers, our goods lays pending at ports more than specific free of cost time. It is beyond the control of Exporters. Due to these crises, exporters are in hot water and bearing delay in export consignments. Hence, kindly intervene in the matter and allow the storage of goods for the unlimited period as well as removal of port charges till the situation persists. The minister assured his positive support to resolve the goods storage charges till the situation becomes normal.

Kashif Mehtab Chawla highlighted another issue which pertains to combine Effluent Treatment Plant for the industrial areas of Karachi. On this occasion TMA secretary general informed the minister that the feasibility of seven projects of Effluent Treatment Plant ready and pending the same from very long time. Your ministry is related to Port & Shipping so we are discussing the same with you. Due to non-existing of CEPT, the coastal area of the sea becomes polluted and it is harmful for marine life. We must install the CEPT to safeguard nature. It will also positively impact on the environment as well as it will reduce the load of usage of fresh water. The minister replied that we planned to establish a committee wherein Trade Association's representatives would also be included to resolve these types of issues on the top priority.

Chairman TMA, Kashif Mehtab Chawla appreciated the minister for spared valuable time for the TMA delegation and shared valuable thoughts and assured his support on the hot issues of exporters.—PR

TMA holds seminar on 'Pakistan Single Window' facility

KARACHI: The Towel Manufacturers Association of Pakistan has organized a seminar on Pakistan Single Window (PSW) facility for its members the other day in the city.

The session was held at the TMA's Mehboob Alam Lari Auditorium and a large number of towel makers-exporters of the association attended to become aware of the PSW system.

Chief Domain Officer PSW, Naveed Abbas Memon told the seminar that the facility will help reduce time, cost, and complexity to ensure ease of business, besides supporting the government agencies in adopting an integrated risk management approach for an efficient enforcement of control on cross border trade.

Under the PSW platform, he said, an ICT-based port community system will also be established and all stakeholders including FIA, Customs, terminal operators, and others will be integrated for efficient cargo management at seaports, airports, dry ports, and land border crossings.

All major components of the PSW will be ready by June 2022 whereas a total of 74 departments will be integrated into the system.

Naveed Abbas Memon said that the implementation of PSW by June 2022 will enable Pakistan to achieve compliance with WTO's Trade Facilitation Agreement besides helping to unlock its potential in becoming a hub for trade and transit.

He informed that more than 10,000 registrations have been received so far in the PSW portal whereas 27 banks will also be integrated with PSW which would save the business community from visiting banks to fulfill the requirement of Export and Import forms. Right now in the first phase, we have five large banks integrated.

Naveed said that another major objective was to establish and maintain a world-class cross border trade information portal under the PSW platform.

The information portal is aimed to help Pakistan integrate to other National, Regional, and Global Single Window Systems related to cross border trade, he added.

The PSW will not only ensure a relief but also reduce the cost of business, besides helping simplify the tedious procedures, human interaction, and departmental paperwork.

The PSW is expected to bring the entire trade of Pakistan to a single platform which would also help improve the country's tax base.



He advised the TMA to disseminate information about the registration of their entity at the PSW.

He urged the towel makers association to let the PSW concerned officials if anyone confronts registration issues in this regard and assured them of solving their problems on a priority basis.

Kamran Alam, Vice Chairman TMA, appreciated efforts for a close liaison between the export sectors and the government concerned institutions.

The PSW, he said, will bring about a confidence build of the export sectors on the government. He said that the exporters' problems should be solved on a preferential basis since they are the economy's backbone.

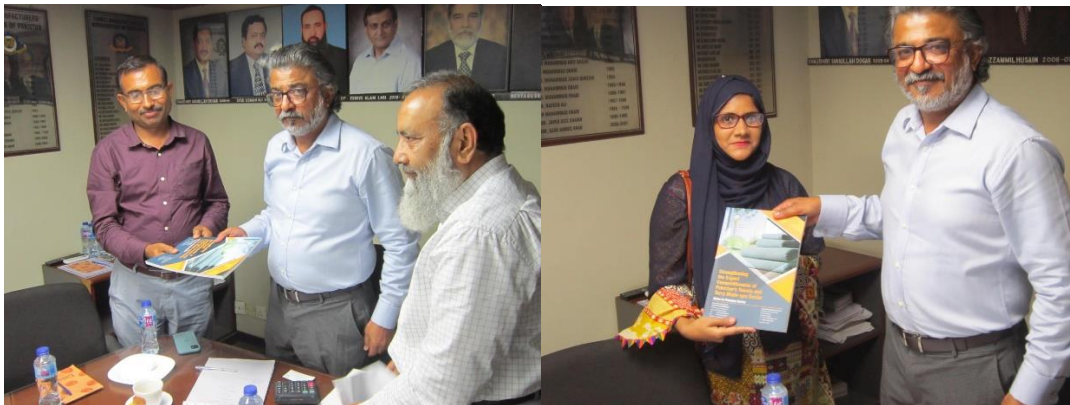

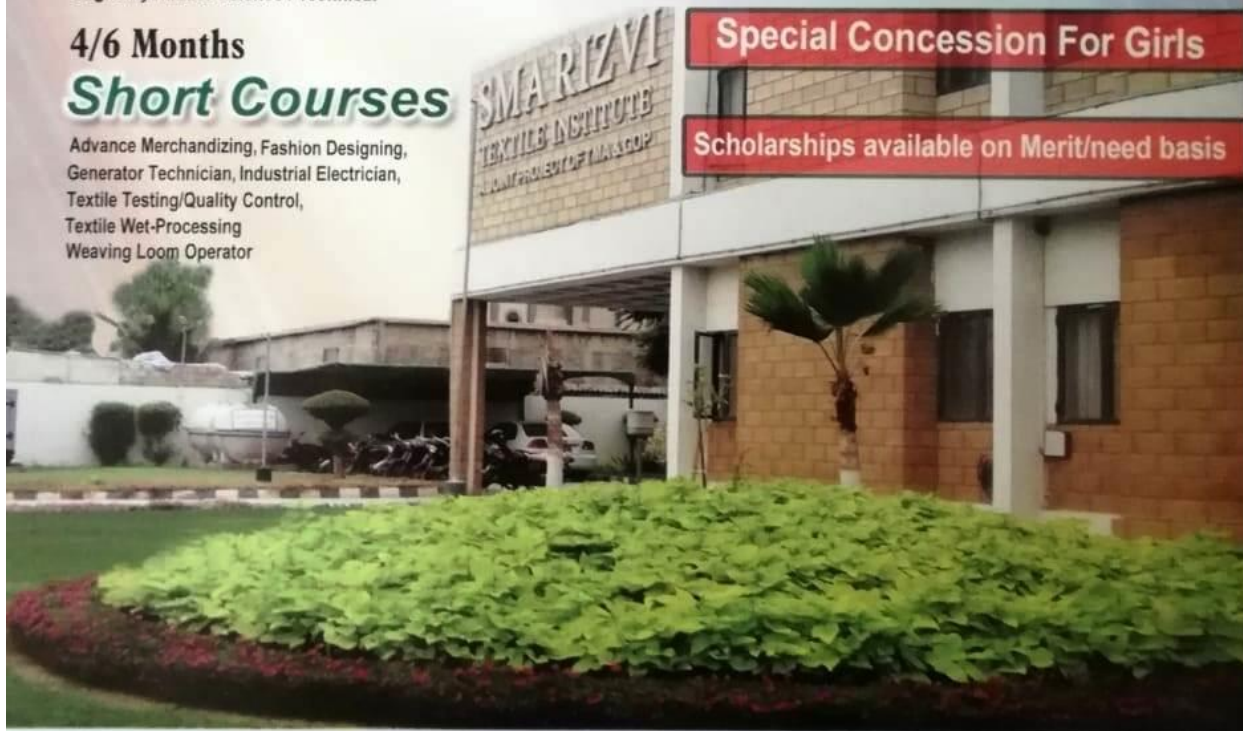
