In the light of order dated 14-02-2022 passed by Honourable High Court of Sindh at Karachi in Constitution Petition No.D-5177 of 2021-Syed Imdad Hussain Shah Naqvi-Petitioner-Versus-Federation of Pakistan and others, in view of Judgment passed by the Honourable Islamabad High Court (IHC) dated 29.01.2020 which has been reported in PLD 2020 Islamabad 306, the Honourable High Court of Sindh at Karachi in wake of Judgment passed by Islamabad High Court has been pleased to dispose of the above referred Constitution Petition No.D-5177 of 2021 upholding the implementation of axle load limits as prescribed under the National Highway Safety Ordinance, 2000.

Statutory implementation of Axle Load limit will not only pave the way to control accidents, save lives on National Highways & Motorways network but it will also help protect the precious national asset of National Highways & Motorways, as heavy amounts are spent on construction and maintenance of National Highways & Motorways throughout the country.
