SBP injects massive Rs3.085tn into money market

KARACHI: The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has injected Rs3.085 trillion worth of liquidity into the money market via open market operation (OMO) for a seven-day period at 12.28 percent, it reported on Saturday, primarily on account of higher government borrowing needs to fund the budget deficit.

FPCCI rejects 250bps hike in interest rate

KARACHI: The Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FPCCI), the country's apex trade body, on Saturday rejected the central bank decision of raising interest rate to 12.25 percent, saying the decision would not go in favor of domestic businesses and industries.

Rupee seen stable next week on SBP rate hike

KARACHI: The rupee is expected to stay stable at around 184 levels against the dollar next week after the central bank increased the interest rates, and took measures to cut imports and reduce inflationary pressures, analysts said.
