## Approval to SME policy delayed: Gas from UEP's fields to SSGCL approved by ECC

ISLAMABAD: The Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the Cabinet has approved allocation of gas under commercial production from United Energy Pakistan's (UEP's) fields to the SSGCL but delayed approval of SME policy subsequent to concern of the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) on proposed tax relaxations and the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) on Rs30 billion development Fund.

KARACHI: Mian Nasser Hyatt Maggo, President FPCCI, Friday proposed that the State Bank (SBP) of Pakistan should not further increase the Monetary Policy Rate as it can result in the stagflation and adverse effects on industrial growth.

ISLAMABAD: Adviser to the Prime Minister on Finance and Revenue Shaukat Tarin Friday said that the government is bringing a 'mini budget' next week under an agreement with the International Monetary Fund (IMF), but it will not end the tax exemption on food items.

## Mini budget next week: Many items to become pricier

ISLAMABAD: The government is set to present a mini-budget before Parliament for withdrawal of General Sales Tax (GST) exemptions and slapping standard rate of 17 percent on import of mobile phones, computers, silver/gold, different articles of jewelry, re-meltable scrap, LPG and many other products.

KARACHI: The Sui Southern Gas Company (SSGC) on Friday announced that the gas supply to the non-export industries of Sindh and Balochistan will be suspended from December 11 (Saturday) to ensure supply to domestic consumers.

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) on Friday announced the long-awaited prize scheme for the customers purchasing from the Point of Sale (POS) integrated retailers across the country, under which Rs53 million prizes would be distributed every month through balloting.

## Why does Pakistan go to IMF off and on?
