14 more bills passed

<u>Procurement of costly furnace oil irks Senate</u> panel

ISLAMABAD: A panel of the Senate Thursday expressed serious concern over the procurement of furnace oil instead of LNG at exorbitant rates and sought a detailed report within two weeks from concerned ministries. The panel also sought report about the closure of two local foundries.

LCCI chief says stable currency a must for real economic growth

LAHORE: The Lahore Chamber of Commerce & Industry has feared that the economic cycle will be disturbed badly and the investors will be scared off if the rupee devaluation against dollar continues.

THE RUPEE: PKR declines

KARACHI: After back-to-back gains, rupee's trajectory reversed as it depreciated 0.09% against the US dollar in the inter-bank market on Thursday. As per the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP), the rupee closed at 176.38 after a day-on-day depreciation of 15 paisas or 0.09%.

Nepra allows Rs4.30 per unit tariff hike

ISLAMABAD: Amid a dissenting note by two of its members and despite 67 per cent of power coming from cheap domestic resources with static prices, the NEPRA on Thursday allowed ex-Wapda distribution companies (Discos) to charge their consumers an additional fuel cost of Rs4.30 per unit during the current billing month to mop up about Rs35 billion additional funds.

Petrol, diesel prices likely to rise by over Rs5 per litre

ISLAMABAD: The prices of key petroleum products are estimated to jump by up to Rs6.30 per litre on Jan 15 for the next fortnight, mainly because of higher international oil prices.

Reforms implemented to facilitate businesses
