Power users may get Rs6.1 per unit shock in March bills

ISLAMABAD: Citizens are likely to see an increase of Rs6.10 per unit in their March electricity bills, as the country paid a high price for producing power from furnace oil and diesel in January.

<u>Fuel cost for power production more than doubles</u>

KARACHI: The cost of fuel for electricity generation in January increased 101.5 per cent to Rs12.22 per unit on a year-on-year basis, according to data released by the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority on Saturday.

Dollar stays bullish on high demand

KARACHI: Despite an inflow of \$2 billion into the account of the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP), the exchange rate remained vulnerable as the local currency lost 0.8 per cent or Rs1.3 per dollar in the interbank market in the last 10 days.

All set to regulate social media through ordinance

ISLAMABAD: In another move to regulate social media despite criticism from stakeholders and digital rights activists, the government is all set to promulgate an ordinance declaring defamation of people and institutions on social media a cognisable offence, with jail term being increased from two to five years.

Gas sector circular debt doubles to Rs650bn in three years

ISLAMABAD: Circular debt for the cash bleeding gas sector has almost doubled in last three years (period ended on June 30, 2021) of PTI-led government to Rs650 billion against Rs350 billion in the FY2018, mainly on account of tariff status quo and unmanageable UFG (unaccounted for gas) losses.

Cost of power generation bloats 76pc in seven months

KARACHI: Country's power generation became 76 percent costlier in the first seven months of current fiscal year compared to same period a year ago, for the most part fueled by expensive RLNG (regasified liquefied natural gas) and coal, industry officials said on Saturday.

High fuel cost in Jan 2022: Power tariff likely to go up by Rs6.1/unit

The costly imported fuel is pushing the government to pass on its full impact to the power consumers. The CPPA, on behalf of the power Discos, has once again approached the Nepra to allow the companies collect Rs6.10/unit additional from the power consumers in their electricity bills of April 2022, as they paid less than an actual cost of power generation in the month of January 2022.

Call for strengthening industries, academia linkages

PESHAWAR: Industrialists and academicians on Saturday agreed to launch joint ventures and initiatives to strengthen linkages between industries and academia.

Rupee likely to remain steady

KARACHI: The rupee is expected to stay range-bound against the dollar next week as importer demand for the greenback appears to be in line with inflows, traders and analysts said.

Gold up Rs650/tola

KARACHI: Gold rates in the local market went up by Rs650 per tola on Saturday. According to data released by All Sindh Saraf Jewelers Association (ASSJA), gold rates in the local market moved up to Rs127,100 per tola.

Rs6.10 power tariff hike on the cards

ISLAMABAD: Power tariff is likely to increase by Rs6.10 per unit on account of fuel cost adjustment (FCA) for the month of January this year as the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) will hear an application filed by the Central Power Purchasing Agency (CPPA-G) on February 28.

Power production inches up in Jan

KARACHI: The power production in Pakistan increased 9% on a year-on-year basis in the month of January 2022 which suggests that the economic growth would be recorded at over 5% in the current fiscal year 2021-22, said Federal Minister for Energy Hammad Azhar on Saturday.
