#### **ECC** takes stock of cotton situation

ISLAMABAD: A meeting of the Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the Cabinet was informed that none of the markets in Sindh or the Punjab witnessed seed cotton prices lower than Rs5000 per 40kg (the benchmark for market intervention).

#### LNG: govt responds to allegations

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Energy, Hammad Azhar Monday claimed that it is the ruling Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), which always imported liquefied natural gas (LNG) at a much cheaper rate than its predecessors, but the issue is that it has to correct the wrongs of the past regimes.

#### SC suspends Sindh govt's minimum wage decision

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court suspended on Monday the Sindh government's July 19 notification of raising the minimum wage for workers to Rs25,000 per month, but decided to set up a three-judge bench to hear the matter next month.

## **Current account deficit hits \$7bn in five months**

KARACHI: The country's current account recorded a deficit of \$7 billion in the first five months (July to November) of the current fiscal year, mainly on account of increasing imports, the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) data showed on Monday.

#### President Alvi calls for early completion of Tapi gas project

ISLAMABAD: President Dr Arif Alvi on Monday emphasised the need for early completion of the ambitious multi-billion-dollar Turkmenistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan-India (Tapi) gas pipeline project, expressing the hope that it would help overcome the energy crisis in the country.

# \$252m IDB loan okayed for KP dam, Covid support

ISLAMABAD: The Islamic Development Bank (IDB) has approved \$252 million loans to Pakistan for two projects — the construction of Mohmand Dam in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and for anti-Covid vaccine support in the country.

#### NCOC allows people over 30 to get booster shots from Jan 1

ISLAMABAD: The National Command and Operation Centre (NCOC) on Monday allowed booster shots for people over the age of 30 years as Covid-19's latest strain, Omicron, infects 58,000 people in 95 countries.

# Withdrawal of GST exemptions to push up inflationary pressures up to 1pc

ISLAMABAD: The withdrawal of General Sales Tax exemptions on 100 items will push up inflationary pressures up to 1 percent at a time when the CPI based inflation had already touched 11.53 percent for November 2021.

# Rupee ends firmer on SBP's step

KARACHI: The rupee ended steady on Monday after the central bank tightened regulations on the purchase of foreign currency, in a bid to discourage speculative buying and selling of foreign exchange to individuals from exchange firms, dealers said.

# **Govt-industry legal battle robs FFBL of feedstock gas**

LAHORE: Natural gas supply to the country's biggest urea-maker has been disrupted as ongoing litigation has altered feedstock allocation arrangements, which may lower the output of this key agriculture chemical input, causing shortages, officials said on Monday.

## Discontinuation of gas supply to industrial sector decried

MULTAN: The Multan Chamber of Commerce and Industry has expressed serious concerns over discontinuation of gas supply to the industrial sector particularly to textile sector and demanded the government exempt the textile industry from gas loadshedding.

# <u>July-Nov C/A deficit surges to 5.3pc of GDP</u>

KARACHI: Pakistan's July-November current account deficit widened sharply from a year earlier after imports accelerated while crude prices surged, data from the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) showed on Monday.

#### Cellular operators oppose move to jack up WHT by 50pc

ISLAMABAD: The Cellular Mobile Operators have opposed the government's move for jacking up the Withholding Tax (WHT) by 50 percent, increasing it from 10 to 15 percent on customers in the upcoming mini budget for 2021-22.

#### Nuclear power share nearly doubles in five months

KARACHI: Nuclear power share increased near two-fold in the country's energy mix in first five months of this fiscal year mainly after Kanupp-II was hooked up into national grid in March, data showed on Monday.

#### Oil prices sink on Omicron demand fears

LONDON: Oil prices slumped by about \$3 on Monday as surging cases of the Omicron coronavirus variant in Europe and the United States stoked investor worries that new mobility restrictions to combat its spread could hit fuel demand.
