Payment demanded to buy coal: CPHGC warns Nepra of closure of power complex

ISLAMABAD: China Power Hub Generation Company (Pvt) Ltd (CPHGC) has cautioned the government that it would shut down its complex after middle of next month if substantial payment is not made to purchase coal as inventory is now depleting.

Housing finance facilities: Maximum limit for modaraba companies increased

ISLAMABAD: The Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) has increased the maximum limit for modaraba companies for extending housing finance facilities from Rs20 million to Rs50 million to facilitate its customers.

Pakistan, Afghanistan can ease concerns through talks: China

BEIJING: The Chinese Foreign Ministry Spokesperson on Thursday said that Afghanistan and Pakistan were traditional friendly neighbours of China and believed that the two countries could properly resolve their respective concerns through dialogue and consultations.

Karachi faces more power load-shedding

KARACHI: Consumers of K-Electric (KE) will face more load shedding as KE said the National Grid authorities have directed it to curtail power supply by 300 MW.

SBP's reserves up \$36m

KARACHI: The State Bank of Pakistan's (SBP) foreign exchange reserves increased by \$36 million during the last week. According to a weekly report issued on Thursday, SBP's foreign exchange reserves surged to \$10.886 billion as of April 16, 2022 compared to \$10.849 billion April 8, 2022.

THE RUPEE: PKR: declines further

KARACHI: Pakistan rupee continued to register losses for the fourth straight session against the US dollar, depreciating 0.56% in the inter-bank market on Thursday. As per the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP), the rupee closed at 186.97 after a day-on-day depreciation of Rs1.05, or 0.56%.

Pakistan gets six 'pricey' bids for LNG

ISLAMABAD: Energy-starved Pakistan has decided in principle to accept a total of six LNG cargoes at bid prices between \$24.15 and \$32.6 per million British Thermal Units (mmBtu) for delivery from May 1 to June 22 period to meet peak winter electricity demand.

Govt urged to ensure next GSP+

LAHORE: The readymade garments sector on Thursday asked new government to initiate lobbying for continuity of Generalized Scheme of Preferences (GSP)-Plus, besides implementing new textile and apparel policy through revival of Pakistan Export Promotion Board (PEPB).

FPCCI laments low cotton output

KARACHI: The apex trade body on Thursday urged the government to take measures to increase cotton production across the country, saying the output was alarmingly decreasing.

Pakistan secures 6 LNG spot cargoes for May-June

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan LNG Limited (PLL) on Thursday decided to source six cargoes -four for May and two for June- to maximise RLNG-based power generation, which is cheaper than petroleum-fired production of electricity.
