## Gas being made available only during meal hours

ISLAMABAD: The gas supply to different parts of the country has been cut short by 15 hours, as now the consumers will receive gas only three times a day (breakfast, lunch and dinner) as per the decision taken by the federal government on Sunday.

## Petrol pump dealers to go on strike

ISLAMABAD: The Petroleum Dealers Association on Sunday announced a countrywide strike on Nov 25 after the government showed its reluctance to revise their margin by 6 per cent of the sale price.

## Personal data protection law on the cards

ISLAMABAD: The Ministry of Information Technology and Telecommunication has finalised the "Personal Data Protection Bill, 2021" and sent it to the Law Ministry for vetting, proposing up to Rs25 million fine for those who processes or cause to be processed, disseminates or discloses personal data in violation of any of the provisions of the proposed legislation.

# IT refunds: FTO issues order against CTOL

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Tax Ombudsman (FTO) has issued a landmark order against an Inland Revenue Commissioner of the Corporate Tax Office Lahore (CTOL) for blocking fully verified income tax refunds by adopting delaying tactics.
