Textile exports decline 11.32pc MoM

ISLAMABAD: The country's textile group exports declined by 11.32 percent on month-on-month basis and remained \$1.471 billion in July 2021 compared to \$1.658 billion in June 2021, says the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS).

Budget deficit target missed

ISLAMABAD: The government has missed the budget deficit target for the last fiscal year 2020-21 by one percent and closed the fiscal year with 7.1 percent deficit against budgeted target of seven percent of the GDP, according to the Finance Ministry's consolidated federal and provincial fiscal operation.
