Gas supply to power sector increased by 71pc

ISLAMABAD: The federal government has altered gas management plan to increase gas supply to power sector by 71 per cent to 325 MMCFD from 190 MMCFD, suspension of gas supply to general industry in Punjab and KP per day on rotational basis and restoration of 75 MMCFD gas to Captive Power Plants (CPPs) for the Punjab-based export-oriented industry from December 29, 2021 (today).

Kati acting president concerned at rising inflation

KARACHI: Acting President of Korangi Association of Trade and Industry (Kati), Farrukh Qandhari Tuesday expressed concern over the rising inflation in the country which he says has reached 20 percent. A further increase in electricity tariff is on the cards, he added.

LAHORE: The United Business Group (UBG), the largest alliance of chambers and associations in the country on Tuesday launched aggressive final round of campaign to muster up support of voters in the forthcoming annual election of Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce and Industry.

Conference calls for strengthening multilateral cooperation

ISLAMABAD: A 9-Nation Conference on Regional Economic Connectivity called for strengthening multilateral cooperation, and promoting Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), and agreed to institutionalise their interaction, counter disinformation and fake news, and rejected any notion of a "New Cold War".

Power co facing 'discrimination': Norwegian envoy

ISLAMABAD: Norway ambassador to Pakistan has lodged a complaint with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs regarding purported discrimination against a Norwegian company which intends to set up a solar power plant.

Supplementary finance bill: Cabinet pauses process over questions

ISLAMABAD: The federal cabinet has delayed approval of supplementary finance bill, 2021, on Tuesday, for a detailed discussion today (Wednesday), may be in a special session of the cabinet, following questions raised by some members.

Lack of consultations with allies leads to delay

ISLAMABAD: The lack of prior consultations with key allied parties in the federal government, compelled the cabinet to postpone the approval of the Finance (Supplementary) Bill, 2021 and the State Bank of Pakistan (Amendment) Bill, 2021, it is learnt.

LAHORE: After most stay applications against the Sui Northern Gas Pipelines Ltd (SNGPL) on supply to the industry were withdrawn on Tuesday, the company decided to start supplying 75 million cubic feet per day (mmcfd) of gas to captive power-run textile export industry from Wednesday (today).

ISLAMABAD: The federal cabinet on Tuesday approved the first-ever National Security Policy (NSP) of the country but deferred approval of the supplementary finance bill [mini-budget] which was scheduled to be tabled in the National Assembly on Wednesday (today).

Traders at MOM moot reject LG law, treatment meted out to Karachi

KARACHI: Just two weeks after holding a multiparty conference that rejected amendments brought about by the ruling Pakistan Peoples Party to the local government bill, the Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan organised a Karachi traders' conference at its temporary headquarters in Bahadurabad to go over the PPP's new LG law here on Tuesday.

Rs2bn power theft loss in Railways every year, says minister

ISLAMABAD: Railways Minister Azam Khan Swati on Tuesday informed a Senate committee that Pakistan Railways (PR) has been suffering a loss of Rs2 billion annually due to electricity theft.

79 confirmed Omicron cases detected in Pakistan so far

ISLAMABAD: While the most transmissible new variant of Covid-19 has reached over 100 countries, Pakistan on Tuesday announced that so far 79 confirmed cases of Omicron had been reported across the country out of which 85 per cent was of local transmission.

Foreigners cut down on govt bonds, securities on weak rupee

KARACHI: Foreign investors pulled out \$334.20 million from the local currency debt securities so far this fiscal year, which is higher than the inflows of \$241.82 million witnessed in such papers, the central bank data showed on Tuesday.

Rupee ends stable

KARACHI: The rupee ended largely stable against the dollar in the interbank market on Tuesday as the dollar supplies were enough to match importers' demand, dealers said.

Fifth Covid-19 wave may start in mid February, warns NHS

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan may experience the fifth wave of Covid-19 in the mid of February 2022 with daily detection of around 3,000-4,000 cases per day as community transmission of Omicron variant of the SARS-CoV-2 or Coronavirus has started in the major cities of Pakistan, especially in Karachi, Lahore and Islamabad where so far 75 people were found infected with the Variant of Concern (VoC), officials warned on Tuesday.
