POL products: GST abolished, PL revised downward

ISLAMABAD: The federal government has abolished General Sales Tax (GST) on all petroleum products and reduced the rate of petroleum levy to absorb the international oil price rise with effect from February 1, 2022.

Dec 2021 Nepra agrees to raise Discos' tariff by Rs3.09/unit

ISLAMABAD: The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) Tuesday agreed, in principle, to increase Discos' tariff by Rs 3.09 per unit for December 2021 under monthly Fuel Component Adjustment (FCA) mechanism to recover additional cost of Rs 26.6 billion from consumers except lifeline consumers.
