# WTO's TPR asks country to further diversify export base

ISLAMABAD: The member countries of World Trade Organisation (WTO) have urged Pakistan to further concentrate on diversifying its export base and making use of the multilateral trading system to further its development objectives.

## Erstwhile Pata/Fata units: No tax relief beyond determined quota after 15th

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has announced that the sales tax and income tax exemptions will not be available to industrial units located in erstwhile tribal areas beyond the determined quota on the basis of installed capacity of units after April 15, 2022.

# Audit, return filing by businesspeople: FBR to give relaxation on integration with new systems

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) will give relaxation from return/statement filing and audit to withholding agents, manufactures, dealers, distributors, wholesalers and retailers, who would integrate with the FBR's new systems.

# Pakistan wants to resolve regional issues through partnerships: COAS

ISLAMABAD: Chief of Army Staff (COAS) General Qamar Javed Bajwa said on Saturday that Pakistan was determined to resolve the regional issues through partnership and cooperation.

#### KE asks govt to release Rs3.4bn under PM's relief package

ISLAMABAD: The K-Electric (KE) has sought Rs 3.4 billion from the federal government as first installment from the prime minister's relief package under which a subsidy of Rs 5 per unit has been approved for domestic consumers using up to 700 units a month and commercial non-ToU consumers having a sanctioned load of less than 5 KV.

# FATA/PATA manufacturing units: FBR directs determination of installed capacity thru IOCO

PESHAWAR: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has directed manufacturing units in erstwhile FATA/PATA to determine their installed capacity through Input Co-efficient Organization (IOCO) in order to facilitate them in import of raw material.

### PYMA exhorts SBP to help arrest rupee's slide

KARACHI: Expressing deep concern over the sharp rise in the value of dollar, chairman of the Pakistan Yarn Merchants Association (PYMA) Saqib Naseem and the association's vice chairman for the Sindh-Balochistan region Muhammad Junaid Teli requested State Bank of Pakistan's (SBP) Governor Reza Baqir to adopt effective strategies for stabilising the value of rupee.

# Political uncertainty rattles economy: Country witnesses \$1.5bn capital outflow during ongoing fiscal year

LAHORE: The Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce and Industry's Businessmen Panel (BMP) has said political uncertainty has rattled the Pakistan's economy, hitting the stock market constantly, as the country has witnessed the capital outflow of around \$ 1.5 billion during the ongoing fiscal year, with major foreign investment outflows from Pakistan Investment Bonds (PIBs) despite high-yield returns on them.

# WTO hails Pakistan's economic performance during pandemic

# OICCI asks govt to rationalise taxes for telecom sector

ISLAMABAD: The Overseas Investors Chamber of Commerce and Industry (OICCI) has urged the government to rationalise taxes for the telecom sector in the budget of the next financial year.

#### **Local startups raise \$163m in January-March**

KARACHI: Pakistani startups raised \$163 million in the first quarter of 2022, which is more than half of the total startup funding in the last calendar year.

#### Exchange rate spirals out of SBP's control

KARACHI: Mounting pressure on the rupee has slashed its value by 3.2 per cent against the US dollar alone in March, leaving little doubt that the falling forex reserves of the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) and deepening political crisis could further devalue the local currency in coming days.
