<u>Business-friendly environment: Speed up work on regulatory reform,</u> PM tells officials

ISLAMABAD: As Pakistan is desperately seeking to enhance foreign investment, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif was informed on Friday that over 200 business-to-business (B2B) agreements along with a memorandum of understanding worth \$70 million have been signed with various Chinese companies.

Weekly SPI inflation up 0.38pc

ISLAMABAD: The Sensitive Price Index-based inflation for the week ended December 19, 2024, increased by 0.38 per cent due to an increase in the prices of tomatoes (56.66per cent), firewood (1.57per cent), vegetable ghee 2.5kg (0.95per cent), cooking oil 5-litre (0.79per cent) and sugar (0.23per cent), says Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS).

THE RUPEE PKR: slight decline

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee reported a slight decline against the US dollar, depreciating 0.03% in the inter-bank market on Friday. At close, the currency settled at 278.42 for a loss of Re0.07 against the greenback.

Gold prices continue to lose ground

KARACHI: Gold prices continued to lose ground on Friday, as global rates inched closer to \$2,600 per ounce, traders said. Down by Rs2,000 and Rs1,715, gold prices now stood at Rs271,300 per tola and Rs232,596 per 10 grams, respectively, ASSJA said.

Sharp decline in cotton production

KARACHI: Retail payments through digital channels grew 9 per cent in volume to 1,699 million transactions valuing Rs36 trillion in the first quarter (July-September) of FY25, reported the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) on Friday.

47pc don't see taxes being spent for public good: survey

LAHORE: Despite taxpayer support for a fiscal contract where citizens agree to pay taxes in exchange for services, a global poll suggests that only a third see the deal working in practice. The poll finds that 52 per cent of respondents ag-----ree that taxes are a co--ntribution to the community rather than a cost (25pc disagree, rest neutral),

Short-term inflation increases for second consecutive week

ISLAMABAD: Short-term inflation, measured by Sensitive Price Index (SPI), went up to 4.64 per cent year-on-year in the week ending December 19 owing to an increase in the prices of edible oil and essential kitchen items.

Frozen dessert makers fined for mislabelling ice cream

ISLAMABAD: The Competition Commis-sion of Pakistan (CCP) has imposed penalties of Rs75 million each on two manufacturers of frozen desserts for misleading consumers by falsely advertising their products as "ice cream".

KE open to adjusting its multi-year tariff structure: CEO

ISLAMABAD: K-Electric (KE)'s CEO Moonis Alvi on Friday expressed openness to adjusting the company's multi-year tariff structure during ongoing discussions with regulator, but emphasised the importance of ensuring a sustainable tariff that supports future investments in Pakistan's power infrastructure.

RLNG price cut by up to 2.72% for this month

ISLAMABAD: The government on Friday reduced average sale price of re-gasified liquefied natural gas (RLNG) for December 2024, lowering cost of super-chilled imported fuel by up to 2.72 percent against prices of last month.

<u>Industrialists keen to set up factory at Quaid Business Park</u>

LAHORE: A delegation of industrialists, led by Mian Tariq Nisar, called on Provincial Minister for Industries and Commerce Chaudhry Shafay Hussain at his office in the Industry Department on Friday. During the meeting, the delegation announced increasing their investments in Punjab and set up a new factory at the Quaid-i-Azam Business Park Sheikhupura for manufacturing synthetic leather, PVC sheets, and factory materials.

PTBA calls for national taxpayers' committee to ensure accountable spending

KARACHI: The Pakistan Tax Bar Association (PTBA) has called for the establishment of a high-powered taxpayers' committee at the national level to ensure transparency and accountability in the utilisation of taxpayers' money. In a letter addressed to Chairman of the Standing Committee on Finance & Revenue, National Assembly Syed Naveed Qamar, the PTBA expressed concerns over the misuse of taxpayers' funds.
