ISLAMABAD: The Tax Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024 is likely to be challenged in courts due to imposition of restrictions on economic transactions of non-filers, which is a violation of fundamental rights of citizens.

KCCI chief for expediting consignment clearance processes at ports

Banks meet ADR limit to avoid tax

KARACHI: The banks have nearly achieved a 50 per cent advance-to-deposit ratio (ADR) to avoid the incremental tax imposed by the government if they fail to meet the limit by the Dec 31 deadline. Banks could not reduce deposits on a large scale but succeeded in increasing the advances by 27pc in just four months.

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has lost 29.6 per cent of its agricultural land to soil salinity and sodicity, according to the first major assessment of salt-affected soils in 50 years, released by the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) of the United Nations.
