# <u>Faceless customs assessment system: PM orders countrywide enforcement</u>

ISLAMABAD: In order to streamline trade procedures and simplify workload, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said on Monday that the faceless customs assessment (FCA) system, currently operational in Karachi, should be expanded and implemented in other cities as soon as possible.

## Separate benches formed for early disposal of tax cases: CIP

## THE RUPEE PKR: marginal decline

The Pakistani rupee saw a marginal decline against the US dollar, depreciating 0.04% in the inter-bank market on Monday. At close, the currency settled at 278.68 after a loss of Re0.10 against the greenback. During the previous week, rupee remained largely stable against the US dollar in the inter-bank market.

# 64pc of adults now have bank accounts

KARACHI: Financial inclusion, i.e the share of the adult population operating a bank account, has jumped from 16 per cent in 2015 to 64pc in 2023, according to the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP).

### Pakistan, Bangladesh joint business council formed

KARACHI: The FPCCI and the Federation of Bangl-adesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI) on Monday signed a MoU to form Pakistan-Bangl-ade-sh Joint Bus-iness Cou-ncil (PBJBC) to strengthen, facilitate and enable trade between the two countries.

#### Petrol, diesel to cost Rs6 more in next fortnight

ISLAMABAD: The prices of high-speed diesel (HSD), petrol and kerosene are estimated to increase by up to Rs6 per litre on Wednesday for the next fortnight due to higher international prices. Informed sources said the ex-depot petrol price was estimated to go up by Rs5-6 per litre depending on the final calculation on Jan 15.

### Textile parks to boost exports

ISLAMABAD: Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar has emphasised the need to establish state-of-the-art textile parks through partnerships with international and domestic investors to boost exports and create jobs.

## FBR to buy 1,010 new cars for recovery staff

# Pakistan, Bangladesh establish joint business council to boost trade

KARACHI: The Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FPCCI) and the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FBCCI) signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) on Monday to establish the Pakistan-Bangladesh Joint Business Council (JBC), aimed at strengthening and facilitating trade between the two countries.

# Rupee ends lower against dollar

The Pakistani rupee closed weaker against the US dollar in the interbank market on Monday. The rupee finished at 278.68 per dollar, down from 278.58 on Friday. Dealers said the local currency relinquished its gains in the previous two sessions, ending slightly lower as the demand for dollars from importers surpassed the inflows from exporter conversions.

## Gold prices drop Rs1,500 per tola

KARACHI: Gold prices decreased by Rs1,500 per tola on Monday in the local market following a decrease in the international market. The ASSJA stated that gold rates reached Rs279,300 per tola. Similarly, the price of 10-gram gold dropped by Rs1,286 to Rs239,455.

### iPhone loses global market share: report

Apple Inc sold fewer iPhones and lost ground to Chinese rivals last year, reflecting the absence of Apple Intelligence in its largest market outside the US, reports Bloomberg. The iPhone slipped a point to 18 per cent market share in 2024, according to Counterpoint Research data.
