KARACHI: The Reko Diq copper and gold project in Pakistan is expected to generate approximately \$74 billion in free cash flow over the next 37 years, based on consensus long-term prices, the CEO of joint owner Barrick Gold said in a media interview.

#### H1 textile group exports up 9.67pc to \$9.08bn YoY

ISLAMABAD: The country's textile group exports increased by 9.67 per cent in first half (July-December) of the current fiscal year 2024-25 and remained at \$9.084 billion as compared to \$8.283 billion during the same period of last fiscal year, the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics said.

KARACHI: The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) of SBP will meet on Monday, January 27, 2025 to decide about the Monetary Policy.

#### **THE RUPEE PKR: marginal improvement**

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee saw marginal improvement against the US dollar, appreciating 0.02% in the inter-bank market on Monday. At close, the currency settled at 278.65 for a gain of Re0.06 against the greenback.

#### Gold shows slight recovery

KARACHI: Gold prices made a slight recovery on Monday, as global bullion value hovered over \$2,700 per ounce, traders said. Just edging higher by Rs500 and Rs429, gold prices reached Rs282,900 per tola and Rs242,541 per 10 grams, respectively, APSGJA said.

#### Spot rate unchanged after release of PCGA report

LAHORE: The local cotton market on Monday remained steady and the trading volume remained low. Cotton Analyst Naseem Usman told Business Recorder that the cotton market is experiencing a slowdown due to an acute financial crunch, with most transactions relying on delayed payments.

#### **Textile exports rise 9.6pc in 1HFY25**

ISLAMABAD: The textile and clothing exports grew 9.67 per cent in the first half of 2024-25, data released by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics showed on Monday. The textile exports maintained a bullish trend with robust growth of 13pc in August, 17.92pc in September, 13.11pc in October, 10.81 pc in November and 5.55pc in December, respectively.

#### PM orders prompt start of Hyderabad-Sukkur Motorway construction

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif directed the authorities to promptly start work on the Hyderabad-Sukkur Motorway, which is now expected to cost almost Rs400 billion. The prime minister issued these directives on Monday while chairing a meeting to review work on all motorways and national highways.

## Textile exports growth slows down to 5.55% in December

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's textile sector, which had experienced double-digit growth for four consecutive months since August 2024, saw a slowdown in December, posting a modest 5.55 per cent increase. Exports for the month totalled \$1.477 billion, up from \$1.399 billion in December 2023.

## WB identifies nine risks to \$20bn loan facility for Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: The World Bank (WB) has identified nine risks for \$20 billion loan facility for Pakistan under the 10 years Country Partnership Framework (CPF) and termed six risks on higher side, including political, governance and macroeconomic vulnerability.

#### Power generation cost drops 10% in December

KARACHI: The cost of generating electricity decreased by 10 per cent YoY, averaging Rs9.09 per kWh in December 2024, compared to Rs10.13 per kWh in December 2023. Electricity generation totalled 7,800 GWh (10,484 MW), marking a slight 1.0 per cent year-on-year increase compared to 7,726 GWh in the same period last year, according to power generation data released on Monday.

#### LCCI, Lahore DC join hands to tackle parking, security issues

LAHORE: The Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry (LCCI) and the deputy commissioner's office have agreed to take joint measures to resolve the pressing issues faced by the city's business community.
