Business community stands divided over strike call

ISLAMABAD: The business community on Tuesday agreed to defer the nationwide strike, as a committee to be headed by Special Assistant to the Prime Minister on Industries and Production Haroon Akhtar Khan would present a workable solution in 30 days to the prime minister and the Cabinet to address their concerns.

JICA sending team for economic assessment

ISLAMABAD: The Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) is reportedly dispatching its Mission to prepare an assessment report on Pakistan's economic situation, which the government claims has improved significantly.

<u>Industrial power tariff: Power Div, APTMA at odds over cross-subsidy</u> calculation

ISLAMABAD: The federal government announced a significant hike in petroleum product prices on Tuesday, effective for the fortnight beginning July 16, 2025. This increase will see consumers paying considerably more at the pump.

Gold prices fall

KARACHI: Gold prices dipped on Tuesday, tracking a slide in global bullion value that fell by \$7 to settle at \$3,365 per ounce, traders said. The fresh dip dragged down gold prices in the local market by Rs700 to Rs359,000 per tola and Rs600 to Rs307,784 per 10 grams, APSGJA said.

Sizeable business seen on cotton market

The local cotton market on Tuesday remained steady and the trading vol remained satisfactory. Cotton Analyst told BR that the rate of new cotton in Sindh is in between Rs 16,500 to Rs 16,600 per maund and the rate of cotton in Punjab is in between Rs 16,100 to Rs 16,300 per maund.

ISLAMABAD: The federal government has increased the price of petrol by more than Rs5 per litre for the next fortnight, starting tomorrow, the Finance Division said on Tuesday. Petrol's price has been hiked to Rs272.15 per litre, with an increase of Rs5.36 per litre.

Govt cuts RLNG prices up to 2.68pc for July

ISLAMABAD: The Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority trimmed prices of RLNG by up to 2.68 per cent for July, citing a marginal drop in terminal charges as the primary reason for the adjustment.

Cotton season 2025-26 faces difficult outlook

LAHORE: Low acreage and multiple other factors may result in yet another low production season, presenting a challenging outlook for the 2025-26 cotton crop year.

Govt slashes sugar import amid IMF concerns, industry pressure

ISLAMABAD: In a sharp reversal of policy, Pakistan's state-run Trading Corporation (TCP) on Monday slashed its sugar import tender from 300,000 metric tons to just 50,000 MT and delayed the bid opening date to July 22, 2025 — signaling mounting pressure from domestic millers and rising concerns from the IMF over policy violations tied to the country's \$7 billion loan program.

Business community split on planned Saturday strike

ISLAMABAD: The business community is split over a proposed shutter-down strike on July 19, amid ongoing talks with government officials over FBR's extraordinary powers in Finance Act 2025. Following marathon discussions with four cabinet ministers, the government formed a committee to address concerns within 30 days.
