There will be no change in solar energy policy: PM

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) is seriously considering launching another registration scheme for shopkeepers/ traders after failure of Tajir Dost Scheme. It is learnt that the new scheme may be announced in the federal budget (2025-26).

Rs14bn tax fraud: FBR decides to take legal action

KARACHI: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has decided to initiate legal proceedings against 463 importers, 106 clearing agents, and several officials from Pakistan Revenue Automation Limited (PRAL) and Pakistan Single Window (PSW) for tampering with over 2,300 customs declarations to evade Rs14 billion taxes.

<u>Withdrawal of concessions to local industry: BMP voices its concern at IMF-</u> <u>govt agreemen</u>

LAHORE: The Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce & Industry's Businessmen Panel (BMP) has expressed serious concern over the government agreement with the IMF to completely abolish additional Customs duties, cut regulatory duties by 80%, and withdraw concessions for the local industry.

Dubai 'removes walls' for free zone companies, allows them to operate in mainland

Dubai has announced new rules that will allow companies set up inside its many free zones to operate outside of them in a move that is being hailed as "a gateway to growth". Until now, a company in the free zone could operate only within the zone and outside the UAE.

Enhancing grid consumption need of the hour

There are efforts and actions being taken to reduce power tariffs and make the grid sustainable. These include negotiations with the IPPs, forcing industry to move from captive power generation by raising gas tariffs exorbitantly, shifts in the solar net-metering policy, and higher taxes on petroleum products to lower grid prices.

KARACHI: Rupee remained largely stable against the US dollar in the inter-bank market during the previous week. The local unit closed at 280.26, marginally lower by Re0.04 or 0.01% against 280.22 it had closed the week earlier against the greenback, according to the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP).
