#### Finance Division outlook: YoY LSM slump shows underlying weaknesses

#### **Govt decides to restructure SMEDA**

ISLAMABAD: The government has decided to restructure the Small and Medium Enterprises Development Authority (SMEDA) with a focus on developing a viable organisational model including five-year targets and a sustainable funding mechanism.

#### Metal sector in EFS: NA body for holding Mar 7 SRO in abeyance

The National Assembly Standing Committee on Commerce Tuesday directed the FBR to expedite approval of Cabinet to hold SRO of March 7, 2025 in abeyance to keep metal sector in Export Facilitation Scheme as majority of the industry is up in arms against the government decision.

### PECA Act 2016: Taxpayers' data declared as 'Critical Infrastructure'

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has declared taxpayers' data as "Critical Infrastructure" and any damage, leakage, unauthorized access or misuse of data by the tax officers/officials would result in imprisonment/fine.

#### Disputes with importers: FBR establishes 'Classification Centre'

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has established a "Classification Centre" to resolve all pending Customs classification disputes between importers and Customs department by August 31, 2025. The FBR has also given deadline of 120 days to the "Classification Centre" for deciding all fresh classification disputes on assessment of duties and taxes of imported goods.

#### IR & Pak Customs: FBR establishes Strategic Tariff, Revenue Analysis Wings

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has established the Strategic Tariff and Revenue Analysis Wings for Inland Revenue and Pakistan Customs to provide in-depth assessment of revenue trends, organizational structures and industry-specific taxation matters.

### **Gold prices nosedive**

KARACHI: Gold prices noticeably declined on Tuesday, depicting a global market's downtrend, traders said. Following a fall by Rs800 and Rs686, gold prices reached Rs317,800 per tola and Rs272,462 per 10 grams, respectively, All Pakistan Sarafa Gems and Jewelers Association said.

#### **Business volume low on cotton market**

LAHORE: The local cotton market on Tuesday remained bearish and trading volume remained low. Cotton Analyst told BR that the rate of cotton in Sindh as per quality is in between Rs 16,000 to Rs 17,200 per maund, while rates in Punjab are in between Rs 16,500 to Rs 17,500 per maund.
