US, China to resume talks to ease trade war today

Geopolitical easing, IMF disbursement may boost stocks sentiment

KARACHI: Stocks closed lower during the outgoing week amid geopolitical tensions. Some recovery is expected in the next week following the IMF's approval of funds and the de-escalation of geopolitical tensions.

Rupee expected to remain stable as IMF approves \$1bn loan tranche

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee remained stable despite cross-border strikes with India, and it is likely to continue this stability after the approval of a loan disbursement of approximately \$1 billion from the International Monetary Fund for Pakistan.

IMF sets stringent fiscal path for next fiscal year

ISLAMABAD: The International Monetary Fund has set a more stringent fiscal path for Pakistan by setting the primary budget surplus target for the next fiscal year at 1.6% of the size of the economy which, this time, is projected to be achieved by largely containing expenditures.
