#### Miftah says takes ownership of 'all' difficult decisions

ISLAMABAD: Finance Minister Miftah Ismail Tuesday said he takes ownership of all the difficult decisions taken by the present government including the latest increase in petroleum prices, and stated there would be Rs10 per litre increase in petroleum levy from 1st September as agreed with the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

# Minister floats 4-point autarky formula

ISLAMABAD: Finance Minister Miftah Ismail has proposed four-point formula – investing in education, reducing expenditure (to live within means) and increasing exports and agriproductivity – as critical for moving towards self-reliance.

## SBP allows ECs to export dollar on consignment basis

KARACHI: The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has allowed Exchange Companies to export US dollar on consignment basis. However, as per the SBP directives, ECs will bring the export proceeds in their USD account maintained with banks in Pakistan within three days.

# SBP agrees to release containers stuck at ports: KCCI

KARACHI: President Karachi Chamber of Commerce & Industry (KCCI) Muhammad Idrees has informed that the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has agreed to release all the containers which arrived at the ports until July 5, 2022 but remained stuck up awaiting approval from SBP.

#### RDA customers: SBP issues service standards on mobile apps

KARACHI: The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has issued service standards for enablement of minimum set of services on Mobile Applications for Roshan Digital Accounts (RDA) customers.

#### July remittances down 8pc YoY

KARACHI: Inflows of workers' remittances fell by 8 percent during the first month of this fiscal year (FY23), the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) reported on Tuesday.

#### FY22 LSMI output grows 11.7pc YoY

ISLAMABAD: The Large Scale Manufacturing Industries (LSMI) output has registered a growth of 11.7 percent during the last fiscal year 2021-22 as compared to 2020-21, the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) said.

# Suspended clearing agents can file appeals before DGTT: FBR

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has allowed suspended clearing agents of the bonded carriers to file appeals before the Director General Transit Trade, Karachi within 60 days. The FBR has issued SRO1497(I)/2022, here on Tuesday to amend the Customs Rules, 2001.

#### All revenue collection-related services remain fully functional, clarifies FBR

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has clarified that all revenue collection-related services including the WeBOC, Pakistan Single Window (PSW) and Point of Sale remained actively operational during the last few days.

# Registered developers, builders: FBR says annual renewal of registration not needed

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has directed all registered developers and builders that there is no need for annual renewal of their registration with the FBR.

#### Minimum wage raised to Rs26,000 by KP govt

PESHAWAR: The provincial government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa has approved enhancing the minimum rates of wages as Rs.26000 per month for different categories of workers working in all public sectors industrial establishments of the province with effect from July 1, 2022.

### Prices of automotives decline

KARACHI: The local car assemblers have reduced their prices up to Rs 1.14 million, taking a lead from other business sectors to pass on the benefit of the rupee's impressive appreciation against the US dollar.

KARACHI: Pakistan's rupee registered a marginal gain against the US dollar on Tuesday, settling at 213.9 in the inter-bank market. While the gain was lower in magnitude, the rupee managed to appreciate for the 11th successive session.

## Cotton market: Prices gain further Rs1000 per maund amid tight supply

LAHORE: The Spot Rate Committee of the Karachi Cotton Association (KCA) on Tuesday increased the spot rate by Rs 1000 per maund and closed it at Rs 19,500 per maund.

## Big industry output expands 11.7pc in FY22

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's large-scale manufacturing (LSM) grew 11.7 per cent year-on-year in 2021-22, the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics reported on Tuesday. The big industry posted robust growth in the outgoing fiscal year mainly because of food, textile, apparel, chemicals, pharmaceuticals, iron & steel products, automobiles, and furniture.

## Trend of rising remittances reverses in July

KARACHI: The rising trend of remittances reversed in July when a decline of 7.8 per cent was recorded compared to the same month of the previous fiscal year, according to the data released by the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) on Tuesday.

### Air travellers must declare currency, jewellery: CAA

RAWALPINDI: The PCAA has started implementing FATF standards in accordance with the government's directives for submission of customs' declaration forms by all inbound and outbound passengers of international flights giving details of their currency, gold jewellery, precious stones and restricted goods such as narcotics, weapons, satellite phones, etc.

## Pakistan may seek 15-year LNG deal with Qatar

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan may seek a 15-year LNG contract with Qatar on a G2G (government to government) basis — two cargoes in a month with a reopening price clause after 11 years — during the forthcoming visit of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, a senior official of the coalition government has told The News.

#### Forex traders foresee rupee stabilising at 185 level

KARACHI: Given the rising trend of rupee against dollar and a possible bailout package from the International Monetary Fund, the forex traders are expecting the Pakistani currency to stabilise at Rs185 against a dollar by the end of the month.

## Textiles exports decline 13.2pc in July 2022

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's textiles exports declined in July 2022 by 13.2 percent to \$1.48 billion over the previous month's exports of \$1.71 billion, with almost all major subcategories' overseas sales slipping over June.

# Pakistan assets rally amid bets for IMF bailout this month

Pakistan's rupee, bonds and stocks are rallying as investors bet the nation will win a bailout from the International Monetary Fund this month and avoid a default.

## Ogra's miscalculation to mire next fuel price review
