## Unpopular decisions: Miftah emerges as a fall guv to take the blame

LAHORE: Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif on Saturday immediately suspended fixed sales tax collection through the electricity bills and directed for formulation of a new mechanism in this regard.

## Miftah again explains why import ban was lifted

ISLAMABAD: Finance Minister Miftah Ismail, Saturday, stated that to comply with the international obligations, the government has issued an SRO to reverse the ban on imports of luxury items.

## Govt allows release of imported goods stuck at ports

ISLAMABAD: Commerce Ministry has issued notification allowing release of goods imported in violation of SRO and landed at port with penalty.

#### Import value of Afghanistan coal fixed at USD140/mt

ISLAMABAD: Directorate General of Customs Valuation Karachi has fixed US\$140 Per Metric Ton (PMT) as import value of Afghan-origin coal imported into Pakistan via land-borders Custom stations.

#### Tax Laws Amendment Ordinance to be promulgated soon

ISLAMABAD: President Arif Alvi will anytime promulgate Tax Laws Amendment Ordinance 2022 to increase Federal Excise Duty (FED) of Rs 36 billion on cigarettes and other measures including withdrawal of fixed tax on retailers imposed through the electricity bills under Finance Act 2022.

#### FCA for July: CPPA-G seeks Rs4.70 per unit hike in Discos' tariffs

ISLAMABAD: The Central Power Purchasing Agency-Guaranteed (CPPA-G) has sought an increase of Rs 4.70 per unit in Discos' tariffs for July 2022 under monthly Fuel Charges Adjustment (FCA), due to higher cost of imported coal, RFO, RLNG and HSD.

#### Cabinet approves changes in LNG policy

ISLAMABAD: The federal cabinet on Saturday approved big changes in the Liquefied Natural Gas Policy, 2011 ahead of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's visit to Qatar.

#### **UFG losses rates on RLNG distribution reinstated**

ISLAMABAD: The government has reinstated the rates of Unaccounted for Gas (UFG) losses on the distribution of RLNG (Regasified Liquid Natural Gas) to pre-August 2020 levels.

#### Public transport: OGRA extends ban on LPG as fuel

ISLAMABAD: The Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (OGRA) has extended the ban on the use of LPG as fuel in public transport and letters have been issued to all chief secretaries of the provinces.
