UN appeals for \$160.3m: 'Pakistan is awash in sufferings'

ISLAMABAD: The United Nations and the government of Pakistan on Tuesday jointly launched a flash appeal, "2022 Pakistan Floods Response Plan (FRP)", amounting to US\$ 160.3 million to assist the national efforts in dealing with the catastrophic floods which have killed over 1,100 people and overall affected more than 33 million people in the country.

US announces \$30m aid

ISLAMABAD: The United States, through the US Agency for International Development (USAID), Tuesday, announced an additional \$30 million in life-saving humanitarian assistance to support people and communities affected by severe flooding in Pakistan.

Oil dives nearly \$6 a barrel

HOUSTON: Oil prices fell nearly \$6 a barrel on Tuesday, the steepest decline in about a month, on fears that fuel demand could soften as global central banks hike rates to fight surging inflation, and as unrest in Iraq failed to dent the OPEC nation's crude exports.
