Forex reserves fall to \$6.7bn on repayments

KARACHI: The State Bank of Pakistan's foreign exchange reserves decreased by \$ 784 million to \$6.715 billion during last week. The current level of the SBP's reserves is lowest since June 2019.

FX reserves may rise in H2FY23: All debt repayments on track, says SBP governor

State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) Governor Jameel Ahmad Thursday said all debt repayments are on track and the country's foreign exchange reserves are expected to increase in second half of the current fiscal year.

Govt seeking \$4.2bn from Saudi Arabia

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan is seeking \$4.2 billion from Saudi Arabia as its foreign exchange reserves have fallen sharply, broadcaster ARY News reported on Thursday citing sources.

Electricity bills: PD says doesn't want to manage tax, surcharge collection

The Power Division has expressed willingness to do away with the role of collection of taxes and surcharges on electricity except General Sales Tax (GST) to avert criticism of consumers due to heavy bills.

THE RUPEE: PKR registers a loss

KARACHI: Pakistan's rupee registered a loss for the fourth successive session against the US dollar on Thursday, as the currency depreciated 0.09% in the inter-bank market. As per the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP), the rupee closed at 224.37 after a decrease of Re0.21.

Modest business on cotton market

SBP's forex reserves fall to near four-year low

The foreign exchange reserves held by the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) plunged \$784 million to a nearly four-year low of \$6.72 billion during the week that ended on Dec 2, the central bank said on Thursday.

RDA inflows hit a two-year low in Nov

KARACHI: Foreign currency inflows from overseas Pakistanis through Roshan Digital Account (RDA) dropped to a 24-month low of \$141 million in November 2022, a local brokerage house, citing data from the central bank reported on Thursday.

Debt repayments on track; forex reserves to rise in second half: SBP chief

KARACHI: The central bank has said Pakistan would continue to make timely loan payments, while inflows were expected to increase significantly in the second half of the current fiscal year.

Pakistan seeks \$4.2bn from Saudi Arabia after dip in forex reserves

ISLAMABAD: In a bid to secure a breathing space amid the depleting foreign currency reserves, Pakistan is likely to secure a \$4.2 billion additional package from the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, including \$3 billion deposits and a \$1.2 billion oil facility, on deferred payment.

LAHORE: Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry (LCCI) has asked the government to clear the containers that were stuck at ports.

'Two Boeing 777s to be inducted in PIA fleet in 45 days'

The long-grounded two Boeing 777s will be part of the PIA's fleet again in the next 45 days, it was decided in a high-level meeting chaired by Aviation Minister Khawaja Saad Rafique in Islamabad on Thursday.

Gold hits record in Pakistan as economic woes spur buying frenzy

KARACHI: Gold prices in Pakistan surged to a record high for a third straight session on Thursday as people took refuge in the safe-haven metal on mounting concerns that the nation's economic conditions will deteriorate further.
