ISLAMABAD: Following in the footsteps of opposition parties and renowned economists, some members of the Federal Cabinet have also portrayed the SBP (amendment) Bill 2021 as surrendering the country's economic sovereignty, saying it would create a state within state.

KARACHI: The banking sector maintained its growth momentum as overall assets surged to Rs 28.79 trillion by the end of the third quarter of CY21.

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has increased the sales tax on petrol from 1.63 percent to 4.77 percent from January 1, 2022. The FBR has issued SRO1(I)/2022, here on Tuesday.

<u>4 new assets to be added to Sukuk structure : Rs300-400bn borrowing from IB sector to bridge fiscal deficit</u>

KARACHI: The government has decided to add four new assets to the transaction structure of Ijara Sukuk aimed at more borrowing from the Islamic Banking sector for bridging fiscal deficit.

KARACHI: Pakistan's currency opened 2022 on a weaker note, depreciating 0.14% against the US dollar in the inter-bank market on Tuesday.

Two IPPs serve payment notices to govt

ISLAMABAD: Two Independent Power Producers (IPPs) namely, Attock Gen Ltd (AGL) and Sapphire Electric Company Ltd (SEL) have served payment notices to GoP, which, according to Managing Director, PPIB will have serious consequences for the CPPA-G besides having adverse effect on GoPs guarantee obligations, well informed sources in PPIB told Business Recorder.

ISLAMABAD: National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) has allowed Karachi Electric (KE) to recover Rs 1.910 billion from consumers at the rate of Rs 1.0751 per unit for October 2021, under monthly FCA mechanism.

PRGMEA slams withdrawal of textile and apparel policy 2020-25

LAHORE: The Pakistan Readymade Garments Manufacturers & Exporters Association (PRGMEA) has lambasted the commerce ministry to withdraw Textile and Apparel Policy 2020-25 despite the fact the ECC and Cabinet has approved

and ratified it after a long delay, calling for the reversal of the decision and its speedy implementation, as it is vital for new investment and marketing plan in the major export-oriented sector.

Local Government Act 2021: Property tax will be collected by DMCs: Murtaza

KARACHI: Administrator Karachi and Sindh government spokesman Barrister Murtaza Wahab on Tuesday said that under the Local Government Act 2021, property tax will be collected by district municipal corporations.

<u>Digital mode of payment : Deadline extended to Jan 31st</u>

ISLAMABAD: To avoid penalty on the corporate sector, the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has granted another extension to the sector to switch to digital mode of payments, up to January 31st, 2022.

Withdrawal of textile policy termed 'deadliest U-turn'

KARACHI: Textile makers-cum-exporters on Tuesday feared the government's move to "withdraw" the Textile Policy 2020-25 will "destroy" the textile industry, terming the decision "the deadliest u-turn" in the country's history.

Cotton: A mediocre season, but what's next?

How's 7.5 million bales? It is still the fifth largest cotton output in the world, and five percent of world production. But it has been achieved at national average yield of 588 kg per hectares, which doesn't even feature among top 30 countries (by productivity) – and is 27.5 percent less than world average and this in a season which was slated to mark the revival of cotton crop in the country. So much for rebirths!

Spot rate picks up Rs 300 despite rise in phutti arrival

LAHORE: The Spot Rate Committee of the Karachi Cotton Association (KCA) on Tuesday increased the spot rate by Rs 300 per maund and closed it at Rs 18300 per maund. The market remained bullish and the trading volume remained low.

Fresh guidelines issued for inbound airline passengers

RAWALPINDI: The Pakistan Civil Aviation Authority (PCAA) on Tuesday issued fresh guidelines for inbound airline passengers, abolishing categories 'B' and 'C' with immediate effect.

KARACHI: The Sindh High Court (SHC) on Tuesday restrained the provincial tax authorities from taking any coercive action against the state-run Pakistan LNG Limited (PLL) and allowed it to clear the LNG consignment without demanding infrastructure cess.

Clear LNG consignments without demanding cess, SHC to Sindh govt

KARACHI: The Sindh High Court on Tuesday restrained the Sindh government from taking any adverse or coercive action against the Pakistan LNG Company and to allow it to clear its consignment without demanding infrastructure cess subject to furnishing of bank guarantees equivalent to differential amount.

'Low cost of doing business, import substitution only way forward'

KARACHI: Economics and management experts have suggested the government to reduce the cost of doing business, work on import-substitution, and improve regional trade via the barter system to make the economy sustainable in the long-term.

Textile firms rattled by likely policy withdrawal

LAHORE: Textile majors on Tuesday lambasted the government over reports that the commerce ministry was withdrawing the Textile and Apparel Policy 2020-25 after fresh inputs by the finance minister, despite winning approval from the Economic Coordination Committee (ECC).

KARACHI: The rupee weakened on Tuesday as cautious investors awaited clarity on the government actions to secure funding from the IMF's loan programme.
