Cabinet approves Rs3.50/unit hike in power tariff

ISLAMABAD: The federal cabinet has approved Tuesday an increase of Rs3.5 per unit in the power tariff, however, around 45 percent of the poor population or more than 80 million people would not be affected by the hike.

IMF cuts global growth forecasts

WASHINGTON: The International Monetary Fund cut global growth forecasts again on Tuesday, warning that downside risks from high inflation and the Ukraine war were materializing and could push the world economy to the brink of recession if left unchecked.

THE RUPEE: PKR declines further

Power tariff up by Rs3.5 after cabinet approves 'rebasing'

ISLAMABAD: The government on Tuesday announced a three-phased increase in uniform base power tariff, starting with Rs3.50 per unit with effect from July 26 to generate funds to the tune of at least Rs900 billion during the current fiscal year and secure a bailout from the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

Parts shortage forces Suzuki to cut production days in August

KARACHI: Pak Suzuki Motor Company Limited (PSMCL) has decided to cut the number of production days in August due to shortage of parts following restrictions on their import imposed by the State Bank of Pakistan.

Pressure on rupee to 'vanish' soon: Miftah

KARACHI: Finance Minister Miftah Ismail said on Tuesday the pressure on the rupee will "vanish" in a couple of weeks. In a one-on-one conversation with Mosharraf Zaidi, CEO of advisory services firm Tabadlab, Mr Ismail said the inflows of dollars into Pakistan will soon be higher than the outflow, resulting in a stable exchange rate.

Rupee unable to resist high tide of dollar demand

KARACHI: The rupee again lost its value against the US dollar on Tuesday in the interbank market leaving no chance to survive against the high tide of dollar demand.

Gold scales new peak

KARACHI: Amid drop in world gold price, the domestic 10 grams and one tola gold rates hit another new record peak of Rs128,172 and Rs149,500, showing a jump of Rs1,029 and Rs1,200 compared to Monday's rate.

Miftah hopes for current account surplus in July

ISLAMABAD: Finance Minister Miftah Ismail on Tuesday hoped that Pakistan would post a surplus on the external front this month as imports would likely be lower than exports plus remittances.

Rupee hits life low for eighth straight session

KARACHI: Pakistan's currency continued its downward spiral for the eighth straight session, shedding 1.31 percent or 3.05 rupees against the dollar on Tuesday, taking its slide for this year to around 32 percent.
