IMF seeks fiscal adjustments in coming budget

ISLAMABAD: The revival of stalled IMF program for Pakistan hinges upon the government's ability to make fiscal adjustments of almost 2.5 percent of Gross Domestic Product, equivalent to Rs2,000 billion, through raising revenues and curtailing expenditures in the upcoming budget.

Inflation over 2 years high of 13.76pc in May on costlier food, fuel

ISLAMABAD: Consumer inflation leapt to over 2-year high of 13.76 percent in May, official data showed on Wednesday, fuelled by rising energy and food rates as high prices of imported fuels compounds the impact of the rupee's plunge this year.

T-bills yields jump on high May inflation

KARACHI: Treasury bill yields rose on Wednesday as data showing a jump in inflation fueled expectations for a further hike in interest rates in the coming months, analysts said. The yield on the three-month T-bill increased 75 basis points (bps) to 15.25 percent,

Rupee extends gains

KARACHI: The rupee strengthened for a fourth straight day on Wednesday on the back of dollar selling from exporters, while hopes that Pakistan and the IMF would reach a staff-level agreement to resume the bailout this month also supported the local unit, dealers said.
