KARACHI: The monsoon season is expected to start from last week of June in the country, as above normal rains may fall during the season, the Met Office said on Tuesday.

THE RUPEE: PKR declines further

KARACHI: The rupee weakened further in the inter-bank market, closing at 202.83 against the US dollar on Tuesday. This is its lowest closing level in history. During the session, the rupee remained under pressure and even hit the 204 level before making a recovery.

PM Shehbaz Sharif underlines need for charter of economy

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif Tuesday reiterated his call for a 'charter of economy' and said it was high time all stakeholders joined hands to formulate an unalterable policy framework to help the country achieve agro-based and export-oriented growth.

Rupee hits all-time low of 202.83 per dollar

KARACHI: The rupee fell to a record low on Tuesday, weighed down by payments for imports, foreign debt, and dividend repatriation, traders and analysts said. The rupee dropped 1.37 percent to 202.83 against the dollar at the close in the interbank market.

Fixed tax rate for retailers under study

ISLAMABAD: The government is mulling over different proposals to bring millions of retailers into the tax net by offering them a fixed and final tax rate scheme in the upcoming budget 2022-23.

KE consumers likely to pay Rs4.9/unit more in July bills

The K-Electric has pleaded with the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) to allow it an additional collection of Rs4.859/unit from power consumers in their electricity bills for July 2022, as they paid less than the actual power generation cost, especially in view of imported gas and oil in April 2022.

SBP allows DFIs to participate in OMO

KARACHI: The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) on Tuesday has allowed the development finance institutions (DFIs) to participate in open market operations (OMOs) in a bid to address their liquidity issues.

Pakistan asks Oatar for more LNG to help ease fuel crunch

KARACHI: Pakistan is in discussions for increased deliveries of liquefied natural gas (LNG) from Qatar, the latest effort by the South Asian nation to help ease a crippling fuel crunch, Bloomberg reported on Tuesday.

Lack of RLNG threatens \$20b export target

LAHORE: Textile exporters have urged the government to immediately restore re-gasified liquefied natural gas (RLNG) supply to the captive power plants (CPPs) of industrial units in a bid to avert any delay in meeting the \$20 billion textile export target for the current fiscal year.

With Rs9.5tr outlay, govt to rely on loans

ISLAMABAD: The coalition government may unveil a nearly Rs9.5 trillion budget that has been prepared on a highly ambitious target of a mere 4% increase in expenses but one-fourth surge in revenues aimed at meeting a core condition of the International Monetary Fund.

NEPRA moves to break monopoly

ISLAMABAD: The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) has taken a landmark decision by granting the market operator licence to the Central Power Purchasing Agency (Guarantee) Limited (CPPA-G) in order to break the monopoly of power distribution companies.

K-Electric seeks Rs4.86 tariff increase

ISLAMABAD: K-Electric has requested the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) to increase power tariff by Rs4.86 per unit on account of fuel cost adjustment (FCA) for April 2022.

Use of plastic money may become expensive

ISLAMABAD: The government may impose 1% tax on all credit and debit card transactions conducted in Pakistan to buy goods abroad or during international travel, aimed at saving the fast depleting foreign exchange reserves.

Rupee dips to new record low

KARACHI: Pakistan's currency became highly volatile on Tuesday, as it dropped 1.37% (or Rs2.77) to close at an all-time low at Rs202.83 against the US dollar in the inter-bank market in the wake of mounted pressure of import payments and foreign debt repayments.
