KARACHI: The State Bank Pakistan (SBP) has announced to extend the financing scheme for renewable energy for next two years. The SBP announced the scheme for financing power plants using renewable energy in 2009, with a view to promote renewable energy projects in the country.

FBR to issue pharma companies' refunds manually

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) on Saturday informed the Senate Standing Committee on Finance that tax machinery would issue billions of rupees refunds to pharmaceutical companies manually till the resolution of FASTER system problems.

Swap premiums fall as banks face dollar dearth

KARACHI: Banks are facing a scarcity of foreign currency, making it harder for them to provide dollars to importers for making payments, resulting in low or negative swap premiums, as the foreign exchange reserves deplete fast in the wake of dried external financing, analysts said.

Rupee fall adds Rs35-40 to local fuel prices since March

KARACHI: The sharp appreciation of dollar against rupee has added around Rs35-40 in the prices of local petroleum products in the last three and half months, industry officials said on Saturday.

Rupee likely to remain under pressure

KARACHI: The rupee is likely to remain trading on back foot next week unless Pakistan reaches deal with International Monetary Fund (IMF) for revival of a \$6 billion financial package, traders said on Saturday.
