Budget 2022-23: SECP proposes withdrawal of 1pc FIF on non-life insurance premiums

The SECP has proposed withdrawal of the one percent Federal Insurance Fee (FIF) applicable on non-life insurance premiums in the Budget 2022-23 to facilitate the insurance industry and insurance policyholders.

Proposals for budget: OICCI for simplification of tax system
