Govt seeks more SDRs from IMF to propel economy

PM completes consultation on 'betterment of economy': Ahsan

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Planning and Development Ahsan Iqbal said Wednesday that Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has completed consultation with the allied parties with respect to the prevailing situation in the country and he would soon take the nation into confidence.

Hubco seeks exemption from application of IFRS-9 on behalf of all IPPs

ISLAMABAD: The Hub Power Company (Hubco) has sought permanent exemption from applicability of the International Financial Reporting Standards-9 (IFRS-9) for Independent Power Producers (IPPs) due to the prevailing situation with regard to circular debt.

\$39.3bn trade deficit in 10 months is not sustainable: FPCCI

LAHORE: Muhammad Nadeem Qureshi, Regional Chairman FPCCI, has stated that the economy cannot sustain the current level of the trade deficit, which stands at \$ 39.3 billion for merely ten months of the current fiscal year, i.e. July 2021 to April 2022.

Faulty integration of Tier-1 retailers: FTO has received over 100 complaints against FBR

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Tax Ombudsman (FTO) has received over 100 individual complaints of the newly integrated Tier-1 retailers, who were not required to be registered, but declared as big retailers by the FBR.

DII (IR) official removed from service for 'aiding' accused

The FBR has dismissed from services, an official of the Directorate of Intelligence & Investigation (IR), Faisalabad, involved in providing counselling/tax advisory services to an accused person nominated in an FIR lodged under Anti-Money Laundering Act, 2010. In this regard, the FBR has issued an order here on Wednesday.

Pharmaceutical companies: FBR body agrees to resolve ST refunds-related issues

ISLAMABAD: The Issues Resolution Committee of the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has agreed to resolve sales tax refunds related issues of pharmaceutical companies during the budget (2022-23) in the light of recommendations made by the Pakistan Pharmaceuticals Manufacturing Association (PPMA).

Power Division considering reconstituting power sector companies' BoDs

LAHORE: The Power Division (PD) is seriously considering reconstituting Board of Directors (BoDs) of all the power sector companies, said reliable sources.

Ogra chief vows to implement ordinance in true letter & spirit

ISLAMABAD: Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (Ogra) Chairman, Masroor Khan, has reiterated his commitments to implement the Ogra Ordinance in its letter and spirit to attract private investment, provide a level playing field to the industry by promoting competition and protecting consumer interest.

'Benazir Mazdoor Smart Card': Sindh govt, Nadra sign contract, says minister

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Labour and Human Resources, Sindh, Saeed Ghani said that the Sindh government signed a contract with the NADRA at the cost of Rs 1 billion to issue "Benazir Mazdoor Smart Card" for providing facilities including health, education, marriage, death and disability of more than 625,000 workers.

THE RUPEE: PKR depreciates massively

KARACHI: Rupee depreciated massively for the 10th consecutive session on Wednesday, pushing the local currency to a fresh all-time low against the US dollar in the inter-bank market and taking cumulative fall during the ongoing calendar year to 11%.

Spot rate unchanged on cotton market

LAHORE: The market remained dull on Wednesday. The trading volume remained low. Cotton Analyst Naseem Usman told that the rate of cotton in Punjab and Sindh is in between Rs 18000 to Rs 21,000 per maund.

UNITED NATIONS: In their first face-to-face meeting in New York on Wednesday, Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari and US Secretary of State Antony J. Blinken affirmed their shared desire for a strong and prosperous bilateral relationship, said a statement issued in Washington.

Pakistan exceeds expectations as growth rate nears 6pc

ISLAMABAD: The growth rate forecast of Pakistan's economy increased significantly during 2021-22, making it the second-highest economic growth recorded over the past four years suggesting recovery of the economy from the Covid-19 pandemic.

Govt commits cut in subsidies, imports

Pakistan is set to move swiftly on reducing massive fuel and electricity subsidies and banning about 30 luxury imports to contain fiscal and trade deficits under a commitment given to the IMF to secure an economic bailout.

Govt lowers T-bill rates slightly

KARACHI: After frequent increase in the treasury bills rates, the government has slightly reduced the cut-off yields giving message that interest rate may not get appreciation. The auction held on Wednesday shows that the 3-month T-bills noted a decline of 29 basis points in cut-off yields. Now the rate declined to 14.50 per cent.

Dollar a hair's breadth from Rs200 milestone

The US dollar once again appreciated on Wednesday and stood at a stone's throw from crossing Rs200, keeping the policymakers confused over the rapid depreciation that evaded the purchasing power of the local currency.

SBP bans trading platforms like OctaFX, Easy Forex

KARACHI: The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has declared forex trading platforms like OctaFX and Easy Forex illegal in the country and warned citizens that these platforms are regulated neither by the central bank nor the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan.

Murad forms body to remove hurdles in way of Safe City project

Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah on Wednesday constituted a joint group comprising officials of the NRTC and the Safe City Authority to remove all the issues and bottlenecks and prepare the final PC-I of the Safe City project.

Ready for 'reforms', Pakistan tells IMF

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has conveyed its willingness to the IMF negotiation team that it will take 'tough measures' such as hike in the POL products and electricity prices but in a phase-wise approach for reviving the stalled \$6 billion fund programme.

Plan okayed to slap ban on import of 50 'luxury items'

ISLAMABAD: In order to slash the burgeoning import bill, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Wednesday approved a plan to slap a ban on the import of 50 'luxury items', including cars, mobile phones, cheese, jams, frozen food items, fish, dried fruit, cosmetics and tyres.

Sindh IGP removed after back-to-back terrorist blasts in Karachi

The Sindh government has appointed Kamran Fazal as the acting inspector general of police (IGP) after the federal government removed Sindh IGP Mushtaq Ahmed Mahar from his post on Wednesday.

Treasury bills yields slide; moderate rate hike likely

KARACHI: Treasury bill yields edged down on Wednesday in a sign that investors' fears about an aggressive policy stance from the central bank to curb soaring inflation have abated for now.

Rupee lost 4,100pc value against dollar in 50 years

LAHORE: The parity of the Pakistani rupee versus the American dollar has worsened more than 4,100 percent from just Rs4.76 exactly 50 years ago, on May 1972, to a whopping Rs200 on May 18, 2022, hence compounding country's economic miseries, research and calculations showed.

Gold up Rs300/tola

KARACHI: Gold rates in the local market rose by Rs300 per tola on Wednesday to reach another all-time high in the country. According to data released by All Sindh Saraf Jewelers Association, gold rates in the local market moved up to Rs138,400 per tola.

Govt bans import of essential & luxury items

T-bills cut-off yield drops by 29bps

KARACHI: The interest rate on commercial banks' fresh financing to the cash-strapped government slightly dropped 29 basis points from historical high above 15% in the recent past, as the Ministry of Finance borrowed significantly less than its set target on Wednesday.
