Subsidy to zero-rated sectors: MoC seeks Rs32bn grant for Power Div

ISLAMABAD: Ministry of Commerce (MoC) has sought supplementary grant of Rs 32 billion to Power Division for supply of electricity at 9 Cents per unit to five export-oriented sectors during the current fiscal year, sources close to Secretary Commerce told Business Recorder.

Fuel shortage, technical faults: NPCC confirms 5,000MW power out of system

SLAMABAD: National Power Control Centre (NPCC) - the System Operator (SO) and an arm of National Transmission and Despatch Company (NTDC) - has confirmed officially that about 5,000 MW power is out from the system due to fuel shortage and technical faults, which implies 10-hour loadshedding across the country.

4 additional cargoes of LNG, five cargoes of furnace oil arranged

The federal government has arranged four additional cargoes of LNG and five cargoes of furnace oil to solve the shortage of fuel for power generation which will help end the loadshedding in the country.
