ISLAMABAD: Trade deficit widened by 64.79 percent during the first 10 months (July-April) of the current fiscal year, 2021-22, and reached \$39.264 billion compared to \$23.826 billion during the same period of 2020-21, revealed the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) data.

Monthly FCA: Nepra raises tariffs of power distributors

ISLAMABAD: National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) has raised tariff of power Distribution Companies (Discos) by Rs 2.87 per unit for March 2022 and the tariff of K-Electric (KE) by Rs 1.3863 per unit for February 2022 under monthly Fuel Charges Adjustment (FCA) mechanism.

System collapse: Nepra imposes Rs50m fine on NTDC

ISLAMABAD: NEPRA has imposed a fine of Rs 50 million on NTDC on account of its inability to restore power supply in a timely manner in the wake of total power system collapse that occurred on January 09, 2021 and took 20 hours (approximately) to restore the system.

Floating solar project: WB invites Pakistan to hold talks on \$341.5m loan

ISLAMABAD: The World Bank (WB) has invited Pakistani authorities for negotiation of \$341.5 million loan to set up 300-MW floating solar project at Tarbela - Ghazi Barotha complex, official sources told Business Recorder.

Support for fuel management: Govt in search of a feasible plan

ISLAMABAD: Ministries of Finance, Power and Petroleum have been directed to work out a feasible plan for fuel purchase to end load-shedding in the country and to ensure sustainable power distribution throughout the country.

KARACHI: Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah presiding over a meeting of Karachi Water & Sewerage Board (KWSB) has decided to launch a vigorous operation against water theft so that water could be supplied to the starving areas of the city.

FTO disposes of 899 complaints in 3 months

LAHORE: Over 40 percent of the complaints were either rejected by the Federal Tax Ombudsman (FTO) or withdrawn by the complainants during the first three months of 2022, said sources.

FBR issues list of 297 unregistered Tier-1 retailers

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has issued a list of 297 unregistered retailers (Tier-1), who are required to be integrated with the FBR's Point of Sale (POS) system.

FPCCI urges PM to impose economic emergency

KARACHI: The apex trade body has asked the government to impose economic emergency in the country, proposing immediate reforms such as reducing policy rate, withdrawal of fuel subsidies, and launching an amnesty scheme to deposit dollars into local banks.

Ex-Wapda power firms to collect Rs2.86/unit more in May bills

ISLAMABAD: The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) authorised ex-Wapda distribution companies (XWDISCOs) to collect additional Rs2.868/unit from consumers in their May 2022 energy bills since they paid less than the real cost of power generation in March 2022.

Forex reserves fall to \$16.5bn on debt servicing

KARACHI: Pakistan's foreign exchange reserves dropped by \$115 million or 0.7 percent during the week ending April 30 on the back of increasing external debt payments and higher current account deficit, the central bank reported on Friday.

Rupee weakens

KARACHI: The rupee fell by 0.50 percent against the dollar in the interbank market on Friday as importers rushed to buy greenbacks to settle payments, with slowing remittances and exports also weighing on the local unit, dealers said.

Gold up Rs350/tola

KARACHI: Gold rates in the local market rose by Rs350 per tola on Friday. According to data released by All Sindh Saraf Jewelers Association (ASSJA), gold rates in the local market moved up to Rs132,350 per tola.
