## **Energy crisis: LNG terminal operators set to ink long contracts**

ISLAMABAD: With Federal Minister for Power Division and State Minister for Petroleum Affairs in place, the government, headed by Shehbaz Sharif, has carved out a plan to wriggle the country out of the energy crisis under which the LNG terminal operators would be allowed to utilize their excess capacity for importing more LNG and would be permitted to ink long LNG supply agreements on BtB (business to business) basis.

#### KWSB told to install meters to ascertain water losses

Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah has directed the Karachi Water & Sewerage Board (KWSB) to put in place an effective monitoring system at the main source of the bulk of its water supply and also at the trunk and distribution systems so that proper accounting of its service delivery system could be ensured.

## Autonomy of the State Bank of Pakistan

The recent public debate about the autonomy of SBP needs to be reviewed in its historical perspective. Till 1993, the SBP was administratively treated as a subordinate entity of the Ministry of Finance (MOF), the banking sector was controlled by the government mainly through the Pakistan Banking Council (PBC) and monetary policy was taken as an extension of the fiscal policy.

### FIA warns overseas Pakistanis

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) on Sunday warned the overseas Pakistanis who are allegedly involved in committing offences on the social media that their names can be put on the Exit Control List (ECL) and can be issued red notices through Interpol to arrest them.
