### Discos' domestic consumers, KE: Base tariff for over 300 units' consumption raised

ISLAMABAD: The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) has raised base tariff for domestic consumers of Discos and KE using above 300 units monthly by Rs 1.68 per unit and Rs 1.39 per unit for other categories.

## Pakistan, Iran to sign barter deal through commerce chambers?

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and Iran are all set to reach a barter trade deal by using the forums of Quetta Chamber of Commerce and Industry (QCCI) and Zahidan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ZCCI), as State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has refused to engage in formal trade with Iran due to US sanctions on the Islamic republic, well-informed sources told Business Recorder.
