Revenue boost: FBR board chalks out measures

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) will take measures to generate additional revenue through genuine tax demands/assessments, recovery of arrears, high impact sectoral audits, track and trace at sugar/tobacco sectors to overcome revenue shortfall following decrease in sales tax rates on petrol products in November 2021 and expected import compression.

POS integration: List of 608 Tier-1 retailers unveiled

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has issued a list of 608 big retailers (Tier-1), which are required to be integrated with the FBR's Point Of Sale (POS) system and would be denied 60 percent input tax credit in case of non-integration.

<u>Inefficient power, RLNG sectors : PSO receivables hit Rs380.464bn mark</u>

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan State Oil (PSO) receivables have touched Rs380.464 billion due to inefficient power and RLNG sectors. This has also made the PSO unable to clear its payables under the head of letter of credit for import of oil and LNG amounting to Rs177,459 billion.

KARACHI: Acting Consul General of Thailand Paoyee Waesahmae has said that trade balance between Pakistan and Thailand was in favour of Thailand, which can be balanced if the difficulties were efficiently tackled by the Government of Pakistan, particularly the delays in signing the Pakistan-Thailand Free Trade Agreement which has been pending for many years.
