AGP describes 13 customs-related notifications as 'high-risk SROs'

ISLAMABAD: Auditor General of Pakistan (AGP) has declared 13 customs concessionary/ exemption notifications of the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) as high-risk SROs, which are massively misused at the import stage. The thematic audit of the FBR on the SROs focuses on 13 high-risk SROs issued during the last five years from 2016-17 to 2020-21.
