Chinese leadership communicated: Security of Chinese, projects 'highest priority'

ISLAMABAD: Foreign Office said Friday that the government gives the highest level of priority to safety and security of Chinese personnel and projects, and the assurance has been communicated to the Chinese leadership at the highest level.

China agrees to provide latest met equipment: Saad

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Railways and Aviation Khawaja Saad Rafiqe said on Friday that China agreed to enhance the capability of Pakistan with the latest meteorological equipment for effectively forecast environmental changes and natural calamities.

RON 95 and above: ECC hikes PL from Rs20 to Rs50 per litre

ISLAMABAD: The Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the Cabinet has approved an increase in petroleum levy (PL) from Rs30 to Rs50 per litre on RON 95 and above with effect from 16th November 2022.

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan State Oil (PSO) and local refineries have raised serious concerns on slow upliftment of furnace oil by the power plants, which may lead to closure of refineries.

Thar power plant to get PPA effectiveness from execution date

ISLAMABAD: The government has decided to allow effectiveness of Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) of 1320-MW of Shanghai Electric Power Company Limited at Thar from August 27, 2019 sans Financial Closure (FC) as the sponsor has almost completed the project with equity of \$ 2 billion, well informed sources in CPPA-G told Business Recorder.

TAPI gas pipeline: Only Turkmenistan offered strategic commitment: Musaddiq

ISLAMABAD: Federal government has received a strategic commitment from Turkmenistan for the construction of the Turkmenistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan-India (TAPI) gas pipeline but no offer has so far been received from Russia or other Central Asian countries under government-to-government cooperation.

THE RUPEE: PKR registers marginal gain

KARACHI: Pakistan's rupee registered a marginal gain against the US dollar on Friday, and improved 0.01% in the interbank market, while the greenback continued to march upwards against other currencies following the US Federal Reserve's rate hike of 75 basis points.

Prices firm on cotton market

LAHORE: The local cotton market on Friday remained steady and the trading volume remained very low. Naseem Usman said that the rate of cotton in Sindh is in between Rs 14,000 to Rs 17,000 per maund. The rate of cotton in Punjab is in between Rs 15,500 to Rs 18,000 per maund.
