Widespread power outages: Southern Punjab, Balochistan and Sindh suffer

ISLAMABAD: A major breakdown in the power system on Thursday due to an accidental fault in southern transmission system, which shut several generation units of 8000MW, badly affecting interior Sindh, Balochistan, southern Punjab and Karachi.

SBP reserves hit three-year low of \$7.59bn
