# **Govt decides not to increase power tariff: Secy Power Division**

ISLAMABAD: The Secretary Power Division on Saturday said that keeping in view increasing electricity prices in the country, the government had decided not to increase power tariff and continue with the quarterly adjustment already included in the electricity bills for September.

#### **KE** seeks negative adjustment in its Sept tariff

ISLAMABAD: K-Electric (KE) has sought negative adjustment of Rs 4.6/kWh in its tariff for September 2022 to refund Rs 7.740 billion to its consumers, whereas Central Power Purchasing Agency-Guaranteed (CPPA-G) intends to pass on positive adjustment of Rs 0.2046 / kWh to Discos consumers for September under monthly FCA mechanism.

#### **Electricity price reduced by Rs4.25: minister**

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Information and Broadcasting Marriyum Aurangzeb on Saturday said electricity price had been reduced by Rs4.25 in October on the directives of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif.

#### PL rates adjusted: POL products' prices kept unchanged

ISLAMABAD: The federal government Saturday announced that the prices of petroleum products will be maintained at the current rate by adjusting the petroleum levy (PL) rates for the next fortnight with effect from October 16 till 31st.

#### LCCI sets up counter to facilitate exporters

LAHORE: Lahore Chamber of Commerce & Industry (LCCI) has established "Export Counter" at LCCI in order to facilitate and to provide proper information and guidance to the exporters.

#### 5G launch: 8 to 10 months would be required after govt policy directive

ISLAMABAD: The government would require approximately eight to 10 months after issuance of the policy directive to complete the process of the 5G launch in the country.

## **Subdued business on cotton market**

LAHORE: The local cotton market on Saturday remained bearish and the trading volume remained low. Cotton Analyst Naseem Usman said that the rate of cotton in Sindh is in between Rs 15,500 to Rs 18,000 per maund.

## Gas sector circular debt bloats to Rs1.5 trillion

#### Pakistan unlikely to default on debts: Ishrat

KARACHI: Pakistan will not default on its debt obligations as its external financing requirements are fully-funded under the International Monetary Fund's (IMF) programme, Dr Ishrat Husain, the former central bank governor, said on Saturday.

#### Rupee seen struggling against dollar next week

KARACHI: The rupee is expected to be range-bound in the coming week, depending on the level of demand for dollars from importers as the central bank has begun clearing pending letters of credit.

#### EU hails progress made on FATF action plans: FO

ISLAMABAD: The recently held 12th European Union (EU) - Pakistan Joint Commission at the Foreign Office to exchange views on all areas of cooperation between the EU and Pakistan - is of added significance as it comes ahead of the Generalised Scheme of Preferences Plus (GSP +), a special trade and investment policy, which is due to expire next year, 2023.

#### PIA cuts fare on flights from Pakistan to China

BEIJING: The Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) has further cut down its fare in order to facilitate students and other passengers travelling from Pakistan to China with immediate effect.
