ISLAMABAD: As more than half (54 per cent) of the families hit by massive floods in the country are sleeping outside, in tents or makeshift shelters, often no more than flimsy plastic sheets, the catastrophe has rendered around 3.6 million workers jobless, badly impacting the livelihood of more than 33m people.

Commenting on the remarks of the US Secretary of State Antony Blinken in Washington where he called on Pakistan to seek debt relief from China so that it could recover more quickly from the floods.

# Bilawal says US, Pakistan in talks to boost trade

WASHINGTON: Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari has said that Pakistan-US ties were no longer hyphenated with Afghanistan and India as Washington and Islamabad were discussing ways to enhance trade and economic cooperation between the two countries.

#### Repatriation of profit falls to \$28.2 million

KARACHI: Profit and dividends earned by the multinational companies (MNCs) on investment in various sectors of the economy dropped 93 percent to \$28.2 million in the first two months of this fiscal year, the central bank data showed on Tuesday.

#### Rupee extends gains, scales near 2-week highs

KARACHI: Rupee extended gains on Tuesday, scaling near two-week highs on expectations that Pakistan's incoming finance minister Ishaq Dar would help the nation out of its economic rut and strengthen the local currency.

#### <u>Japanese investors offered to lead Pakistan's clean energy drive</u>

# Price of petrol likely to drop by Rs9

ISLAMABAD: The prices of petroleum products are likely to come down up to Rs15 from October 1 due to a sharp decline in rates of POL in international markets, sources said on Tuesday.

### Dar's comeback flips sentiment
