#### THE RUPEE: PKR continues to sustain losses

KARACHI: Pakistan's rupee continued to sustain losses against the US dollar for the fourth successive session, settling with a depreciation of 0.9% on Wednesday. As per the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP), the rupee closed at 223.42 after declining by Rs2 against the greenback.

## **Delay in sales tax refunds worries exporters**

KARACHI: The Value-Added Textile Exporters have showed dismay over delays in release of their sales tax refunds worth billions of rupee against approved refunds payment orders (RPOs), saying the slow-down was causing them financial hardships and a liquidity crunch.

#### Govt raises Rs817bn via T-bills

KARACHI: The government has raised Rs817 billion through an auction of the Market Treasury Bills (T-bills), with yields on 6 and 12 months' papers increasing slightly, a statement said on Wednesday.

## **Dollar crushes major world currencies**
